The 2017 season is nearly finished!

(Our last Sunday afternoon opening is on 29th October)



By the end of September, an estimated 1762 people had visited the mill and visitor centre this year - an increase of 24% on last year's figure.

Local primary school children learn about life in Victorian times, as well as working in the mill, making bread, and a range of craft activities.



At the other extreme, we hosted forty members of the International Molinological Society, who had come from as far away as Canada and Japan to visit British mills.

WREN comes to our support again



We are delighted to announce that WREN (Waste Recycling Environmental) has approved grants to the Mill Trust totalling £11,900. This funding will allow us to replace



the rotten windows in the Victorian mill building, purchase new wooden cogs which our volunteers will fit to the mill's gear wheels, and replace the old linotile flooring in the visitor centre.

Other projects for the winter



During the winter our maintenance team will also be busy on a variety of other projects. We have to finish the re-timbering of the water wheel (started last winter), and its worn main bearings are to be replaced. Leaking sluice gates will be repaired, and there is



landscaping and drainage work to be done in the grounds.

In September, Virginia Kettle and the Dreamkeepers treated us to a wonderful musical evening, with the profits in aid of mill funds.

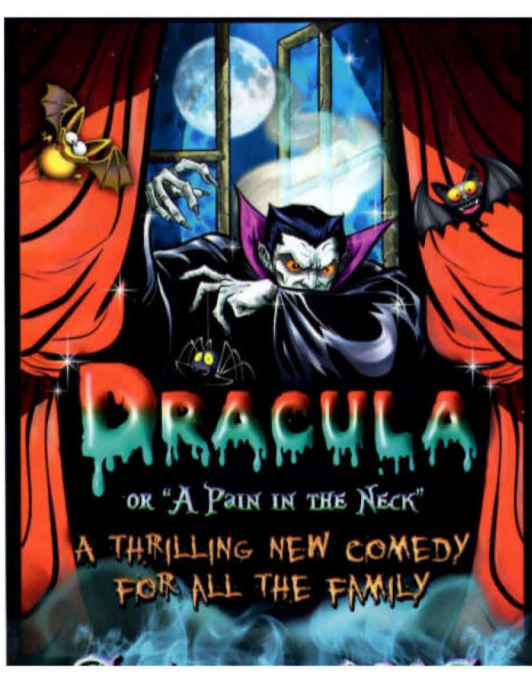
