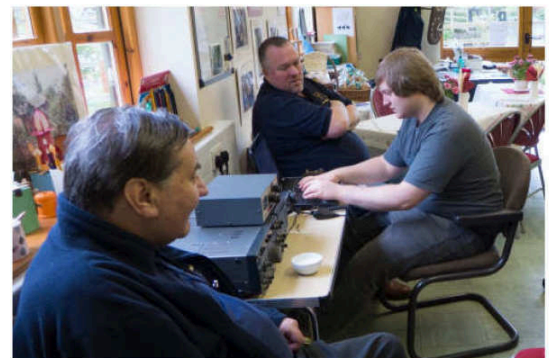

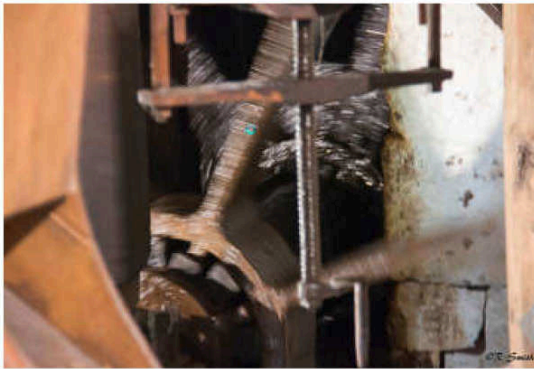


SCARS at the mill
