Hire of the Visitor Centre for Non-Mill Events

The mill's visitor centre is available for hire by individuals or groups for private events not directly connected with the mill itself. The centre provides a pleasant and convenient venue for private birthdays and anniversary parties, meetings of clubs, educational groups, art and craft workshops, and other similar activities.

The facility is available to individuals and groups of any type, with the proviso that if the hirer is a group or club with religious, political or specific cultural orientations, it must be made clear that the charitable trust is not a supporter of the organisation and does not express any opinion regarding the views promulgated by the group.

Facilities

The Visitor Centre comprises a meeting room of 84 m² with associated kitchen and toilet facilities. Photographs showing the centre and examples of its use can be seen on our web site www.bunburymill.com. The venue is suitable for parties of up to around 40 if completely inside, or up to 100 if the picnic areas are used as well.

There is ample free car parking well away from the public road, and users of the centre have free access to the scenic area surrounding the mill pond.

The centre is amply provided with chairs and tables. Hirers can have use of the kitchen area, which is equipped with crockery, cutlery and kettles. Alternatively, we are able to provide refreshments by prior arrangement with our catering organisation.

The toilet facilities include an easy-access unit.

General Conditions

Charges are at the discretion of the Trustees - a guideline price for normal events is £50 per day, which may be modified or waived in appropriate cases.

Unless agreed otherwise, the hirer is expected to leave the centre building and grounds as found, otherwise a cleaning charge will be made. The hirer agrees to meet the reasonable cost of repairing any loss of or damage to the Trust's buildings and equipment.

Hirers should be aware of the Trust's Risk Assessment for Visitors (available on our web site) and take all relevant precautions. The Trust will not accept responsibility for any loss or injury resulting from non-compliance with the requirements of the Risk Assessment.

The Trustees have the right on reasonable grounds to refuse any particular request for use of the centre.
